

NDIS Decision Appeal

WHAT TO DO WHEN THE NDIS HAS DECLINED YOUR ACCESS REQUEST

If you disagree with a decision made by the [NDIS](#), you can contact them to ask them to explain their reasons.

You can apply to the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) for an [internal review](#) of the decision. You must apply for a review within three months of their decision.

If you are unhappy with the findings of this internal review you can apply for an external review by the [Administrative Appeals Tribunal \(AAT\)](#). The AAT is an independent body that reviews government decisions.

The NDIS has an [Appeals Program](#) which helps you to access support when appealing to the AAT. The first step is to read through the information about the program.
